Paranordic categories will also be governed by WPNS Rules and Regulations for Cross Country Skiing and Biathlon, October 2021. Sanctioning: Cross Country Saskatchewan.



CANCELLATION: In the event that weather or trail conditions require cancellation of the race(s), the Race Jury will follow Saskatchewan Winter Games protocols.

Races must be cancelled, delayed or postponed if the temperature on the coldest part of the course is below -20° C. Junior categories must be cancelled, delayed or postponed if the temperature on the coldest part of the course is below -15°C.

The Race Committee also reserves the right to modify race format, distances and start times before or on race day due to weather or trail conditions.
